Our speakers this past Monday aim to change this experience for all travelers on the roadways in Georgia.

On August 1st 2022, The Georgia Department of Transportation spoke to the Rotary Club of Sandy Springs to provide updates on the Transform 285/400 Project as well as the Express lanes that are coming to SR400 and I-285.

Marlo L. Clowers, Alternative Delivery Program Manager at the Georgia Department of Transportation, provided an update on the much anticipated Transform 285/400 Project. The key focuses of the project include:

- New ramps and flyover bridges at the I-285/SR 400 Interchange
- New Collector-Distributor (CD) lanes and bridges between Long Island Drive and Ashford Dunwoody on I-285
- Bridge Replacements over Glenridge, SR 400, and Peachtree Dunwoody
- Bridge Deck Improvements on Long Island Drive and Lake Forest Drive
- New CD lanes and bridges between Glenridge Connector and Pitts Road
- Bridge Replacements at Mount Vernon Highway and SR 400 over Abernathy Road
- A new diverging diamond interchange at Abernathy Road



Clowers noted two of the most recent accomplishments to the project are the new bridge from I-285 Eastbound to SR 400 Northbound and a new exit on SR 400 Northbound to Abernathy Road.



Tim Matthews, Georgia DOT State Express Lanes Administrator, spoke about the new express lanes that will be coming to SR 400 and I-285 to make that white-knuckled rush hour commute less stressful and more efficient.

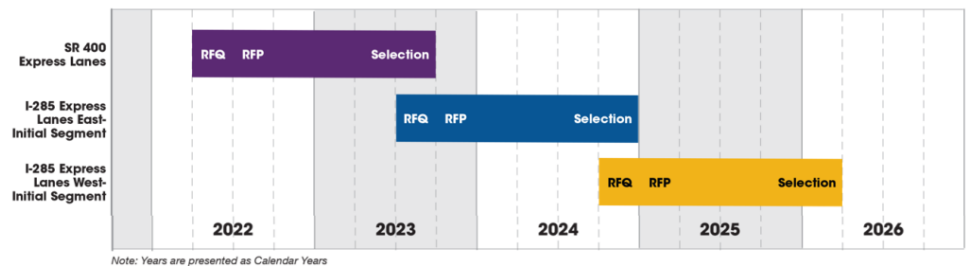
