## It's Almost Time for Baseball!!!

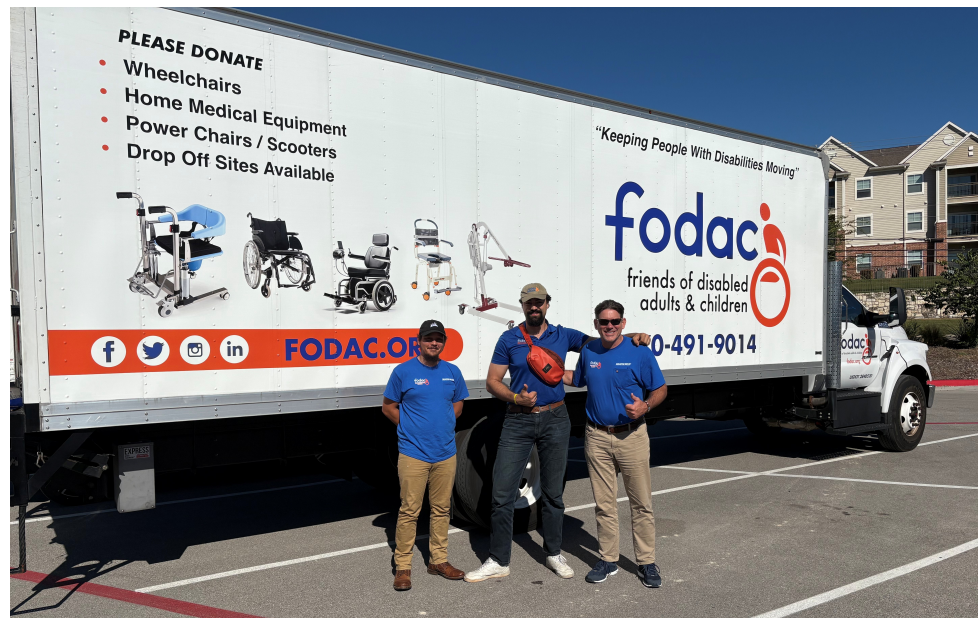
