Saturday's fun on the Greenway started bright and early and the artists showed up ready to paint. We had some volunteers on bikes, exchanging supplies needed by the artists, some were on foot, and others were on a borrowed Gator to make the delivery of water and large items easier between the 2 miles we were spread out on the Greenway. Our most important job was to ensure the safety of the artists while they worked - many volunteers were "monitoring" an artist (or 2 or 3). This would not have been possible without the incredible support of the North Fulton Fire Departments. To commemorate reaching this milestone, Richard handed out 4 Way Test Coins to two attendees. Many thanks to our training team for your commitment and dedication to this project. Classes will be an ongoing part of our community service projects, albeit with a less intense pace!
