Lindsay was born and raised in Georgia. The daughter of immigrants, Lindsay earned degrees from Penn and Harvard, held high positions in her 15-year business career, and started her own renewable energy company – all while raising three young boys. When Lindsay co-founded her renewable energy company, Cherry Street Energy, she traveled around Georgia and soon realized how communities and local residents are being left behind in your leadership at the state level. In May 2018, she won the Democratic nomination with 65% of the statewide vote. Lindsay has broken hard raising records, attracted widespread grassroots support, and received endorsements from leaders at all levels in Georgia. Lindsay will be the first Democratic woman ever elected to the Public Service Commission.
