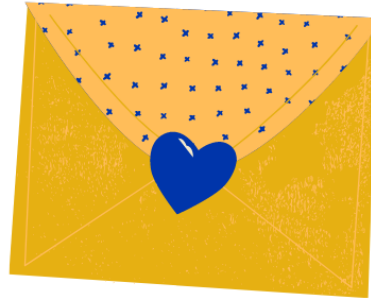

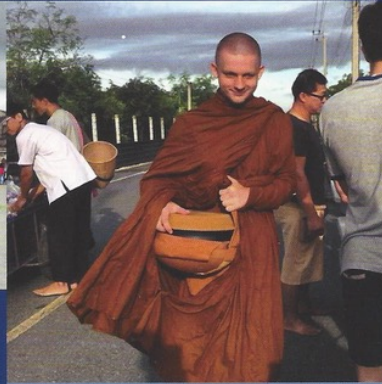
### GRSP Update Calling All Former Host Families, Trustees
