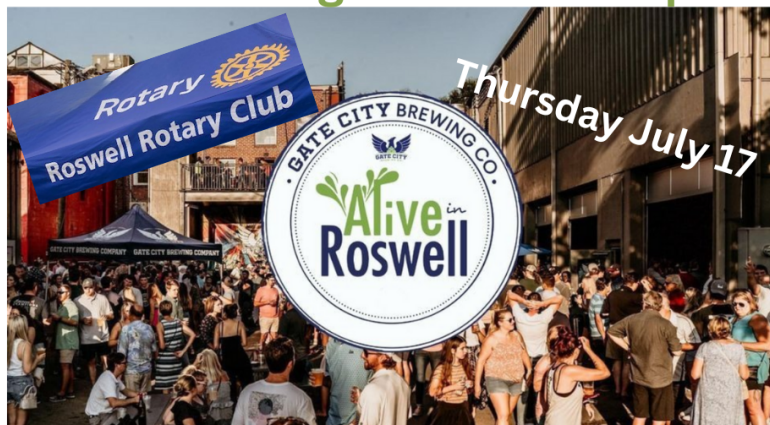
Alive in Roswell
