Early Reading Program at Woodward Elementary


On Tuesday, September 27th we have the opportunity to join Brookhaven, South DeKalb, Dunwoody, and Decatur Rotary Clubs as <u>volunteer classroom readers</u> participating in the Early Reading Program for <u>Pre-K and Kindergarten children at Woodward Elementary School</u>. We will be part of the effort to provide Language Nutrition, Access, and a Positive Learning Climate for these children, many of whom are from families where English is their second language. We, along with our sister clubs, are participating along with the Ferst Foundation to provide each child with a new book every month. 

Leadership Exchange Program

Rotary is filled with leaders, young and old, and what better way to leverage our time in Rotary for personal and professional growth than **to bring our members together** in a mentoring-style leadership exchange? As a way to help provide more value to our members while "connecting generations," the district's first-ever Leadership Exchange Program has been created.

Highlights of the program include:

Signup period runs from now until Saturday, October 15th.

Mentors and Mentees will be paired based on their business interests and experience. Pairings will be announced by Friday, October 21st.

A kickoff luncheon will take place Saturday, October 29th (location TBD).

The program is intended to be approximately 80% business-focused and 20% Rotary-focused. Each mentor/mentee pair will have the flexibility to choose how often they meet and whether they do so in person or by digital means, but the general expectation is that each pair will interact at least once every two weeks.

The program will run from October through April.

ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE

Will North Atlanta Rotary be one of the first clubs in Georgia to participate in the Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE) Scholarship Program?

The RYE outbound student program has been rebranded as the Rotary Youth Exchange Scholarship, to better represent the \$24,000 value of the program. A limited number of scholarships will be awarded in District 6900 for the 2017/2018 school year. There is no cost to the sponsoring Rotary Clubs that offer the program to Georgia high school students. The 2017-18 fee is \$5500 for each student, including a \$150 application fee.

High school students age 15-18* years of age in District 6900 may apply for the scholarships beginning in September, via their local Rotary Club, and the application **deadline** is **October 31**. Scholarships will be awarded in December. (*applicants must not turn 18 before March 31, 2017)

Successful high school student candidates will spend 11 months overseas, living with local families carefully selected by our Rotarian partners in one of 30 different countries. They will attend a local high school while becoming fluent in their target language. Georgia high school students who participate in the program will go through an eight-month preparatory period before leaving on their exchange, and upon their return will spend time visiting Georgia Rotary clubs to make presentations about their RYE experience overseas.

Dist. 6900 has selected 14 high schools in greater Atlanta in which to promote the scholarship program, and we will be holding informational meetings for students and their parents in mid-September. To join one of the informational sessions, interested high school students and their parents should contact one of the District 6900 RYE program trained volunteers.
