2016 Police Dept. Civilian Employee of the Year Claudette Black

Claudette Black has worked at the Sandy Springs Police Department since June 2006. She is the Terminal Agency Coordinator (TAC) between SSPD, the GBI, and FBI. As the Agency TAC, she is responsible for all GCIC Workbook/Security and Awareness Training for the entire police department and IT personnel.

Mrs. Black has a total of 26 years working for two law enforcement agencies. She began her career working as a Jailor with the Smyrna Police Department; a position she held for 10 years and later transferred to become that agency Assistant TAC for another six years. As the SSPD Agency TAC, her duties are not limited to just the Sandy Springs Police Department, but also to the Johns Creek Police Department to provide timely and accurate entries into the GCIC/NCIC database. Sandy Springs GCIC operates in real time 24/7, 365 days a year to support all law enforcement agencies within and outside the United States. Under her guidance, the Sandy Springs GCIC has flourished. At the conclusion of SSPD's April 2016 GBI Audit, the department received a near-perfect audit and placed in the top 1% statewide.

2016 Police Officer of the Year Officer Tim Burell

He attended North GA Technical College where he received his degree in Automotive Technology. Officer Burell works with Ronald McDonald House, providing meals to families and works with the GA Special Olympics, where he sits on the Executive Council Board.
