THIS WEEKS SPEAKER - JAMIE BENDALL

Jamie Bendall did his first open mic in the fall of 1991 at a place called The Comedy Act Theater. Some of the other amateurs at that show included Don Curry, Bruce Bruce, Tim Murraray, Sommore, and Chocolate. Currently, Jamie is an attorney

licensed to practice in New York, Georgia, and Massachusetts with the law firm of Bendall & Mednick (www.reallawyers.net).

His primary practice area is in personal injury where he helps get justice for those who have been injured or killed by the negligence of others. Some call it ambulance chasing, but he calls it an honorable way to make a living.

Jamie briefly was an NFL agent but gave it up when none of his clients stuck on a roster. He hosted a radio show for nearly four years on WGST on in Atlanta called "The Legal Edge" with George Stein the DUI Lawyer. The show was great, its disappearance from the airwaves is still lamented to this day, but since neither Jamie or George were willing to compromise their integrity the show was canceled.
