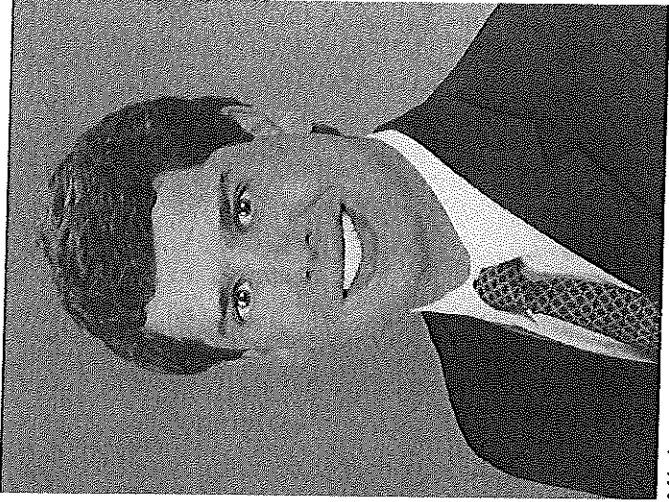

This Week's Speaker: District Governor Raymond Ray



Raymond Ray is a native of Griffin, Georgia. A 1980 graduate of North Georgia College, with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice, he was commissioned an officer in the United States Army Engineer Corps. He served in numerous assignments both overseas and in the continental United States. In 1991 he left active duty, joining the United States Army Reserves and returning to Griffin to assist with his father's business. Raymond worked in Real Estate until recalled to active duty for Operation Desert Storm. Raymond went on to work as a Federal Civil Servant until 1996 when he again returned to Griffin as General Manager for Dan J Smith Distributors, Inc from 1996 to 2008. Raymond worked with PetroSouth Inc. as the Central Division Manager from 2008 to 2015. He is currently retired from the United States Army and the petroleum industry.

Raymond continued his education while serving on active duty. He worked toward his Masters Degree in Business Administration with Embry Riddle Aeronautical College. He has earned many course completion and training certificates from the United States Army, including financial, administration, logistics & operations management, and the Combined Arms Staff College. He served as a member and Chairperson of the Griffin-Spalding Board of Education from 2000-2008, member and Chairperson of the Griffin-

Spalding Educational Foundation and the Griffin-Spalding Partners in Education. He was Chairperson of the Flynt River BSA Golden Eagle Dinner 2009/10 and Membership Chair for the Flynt River BSA. He has been a member of the Griffin-Spalding Chamber of Commerce since 1999.

A Past President of the Rotary Club of Griffin Daybreak (2008-2009), he was awarded the Sheffield Leadership Award. He was also recognized with the Follow Me award by Rotary District 6900 as the Assistant Governor of the Year in 2012. He is a Paul Harris Society Member in support of The Rotary Foundation. He served as Assistant Governor for the Barnesville, Griffin, Jackson-Butts County and Peachtree City Rotary Clubs from 2012-2015. Raymond is currently serving his second term as a Spalding County Commissioner.

Raymond is married to the former Edith Dallas of Griffin, Georgia. Raymond and Edith have five children between them; Megan Burton, Amanda Warren, Toby Ray, Taylor Ray and Laurel Goins. They have seven grandchildren, Mykala and Easton Burton, Ansley & Sydney Ray, Raylan Goins and Brennan & Sara Reese Warren. Grandchild # 8 is due November 2016. John F. Germ is board chair and chief executive officer of Campbell and Associates Inc., consulting engineers. He joined the firm as an engineer in 1965 after four years in the U.S. Air Force. He serves on the boards of several organizations, including the board and executive committee of the Public Education Foundation, Orange Grove Center Inc., and as board chair of Blood Assurance Inc. He also is founder and treasurer of the Chattanooga State Technical Community College Foundation and president of the Tennessee Jaycee Foundation.

He was Tennessee Young Man of the Year in 1970; Engineer of the Year, 1986; Volunteer Fundraiser of the Year, 1992; and Tennessee Community Organizations Volunteer of the Year, 2009. He is a recipient of the Boy Scouts Silver Beaver Award and the Arthritis Foundation Circle of Hope Award. In 2013, the White House recognized him as a Champion of Change.

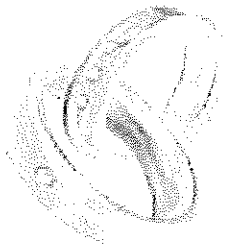
