


He is married to his wife Robbie and they have 2 grown children & 2 grandchildren. We thank & honor Reverend Certain for his impeccable service to God & country!

Trinity House in downtown Atlanta is a 36-bed transitional housing and rehabilitation program. Much more than a shelter – it's a life line for men to turn their lives around. Trinity House-Big Bethel restores hope by providing support services leading back to employment, income, and recovery.
