### TODAY'S SPEAKER: Milton Overton



Milton Overton was named Director of Athletics on October 31, 2017, and officially took over the reins at Kennesaw State University on Dec. 13.

A 25-year veteran of college athletics administration, Overton spent the last two years as director of athletics at Florida A&M University. He is the fourth individual to hold the position at Kennesaw State.

Following a six-year stint as senior associate athletics director at the University of Alabama, and six years prior as associate athletics director at Texas A&M University, Overton was hired to lead Florida A&M Athletics in June 2015.

In the midst of his arrival at KSU, the Owls were putting together the most successful season in program history in 2017-18, capturing seven regular season championships and winning

two more tournament titles. In all, Kennesaw State sent eight teams to NCAA postseason play, culminating with football advancing to the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs in just its third season of competition.

Kennesaw State added one more trophy to its case at the end of the year, winning the 2017-18 ASUN Bill Bibb Trophy as all-sport champions of the league. The Owls overtook three-time defending champion FGCU, registering 240 total points out of a possible 339 for 70.8 percent.

Overton guided a remarkable transformation at FAMU. By instilling a sense of accountability and fiscal responsibility, the Rattlers made monumental strides in the areas of fundraising and fan development. For the first time in more than decade, the athletics department boasted a balanced budget in 2016-17, while achieving three consecutive years of record-breaking fundraising and ticket-sales growth.

Florida A&M's revenue increased by \$2 million under Overton's watch and fan participation has soared with the football team finishing among the top five in FCS attendance in 2015 and top three in 2016. One of his benchmark initiatives was the establishment of FAMU's giving program, "Investing in Champions," that was a key component of the increased revenue.

Thanks in part to Overton's emphasis on academics and NCAA compliance, FAMU boasted higher team grade point averages and increased APR scores across every sport. Under his watch, each Rattler team remained eligible for NCAA postseason competition for the first time in several years.

At Alabama from 2009 to 2015, Overton provided oversight for \$25 million in budgets and equipment, while producing \$6 million in new revenue-generation and cost-saving initiatives. He oversaw seven units, including the No. 1 trademark licensing program for intercollegiate athletics – Crimson Tide Productions – marketing and branding, outbound ticket sales, photography, coaches film video group, athletics information and event technology, track and field, and cross country.

As a member of Texas A&M's senior staff, he raised \$250,000 for men's tennis facility upgrades and led the technology renovations and construction for several other facilities, including Kyle Field. He also provided oversight of seven TAMU sports programs.

Overton is a 2009 graduate of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's (NCAA) Pathway Program – formerly known as the NCAA's Fellows Leadership Development Program. The Pathway Program provides senior-level athletics administrators with a rigorous curriculum and mentorship for preparation on becoming a director of athletics. As a 2007-2008 NCAA Fellow, Overton participated in a yearlong, intensive learning opportunity for 12 selected senior leaders representing NCAA Divisions I, II, and III.

A four-year starter as an offensive lineman at the University of Oklahoma, Overton earned a bachelor's degree in sociology in 1995. He went on to earn two master's degrees from OU in 1998, one in higher education and administration and the other in human relations. Overton worked in academic services and as the CHAMPS/LifeSkills Coordinator for OU before joining the athletics department at Texas Christian University in 1999. Overton was director of academic support at TCU, where he also served as an adjunct professor.

Overton was the founder and CEO of Enki System Inc., from 2000-2011, which provided software solutions for athletic and academic support programs across the country, generating over \$1 million in gross sales.

A native of Fort Worth, Texas, Overton has two sons, Micaiah and Lebbeus.

#### Minutes from the November 7 Meeting

President-Elect **Chris Bethel** opened today's meeting of the RC of Marietta by inviting all to stand with applause for this day's special guest, Court Dowis, Governor of Rotary District

Among our guests were Ms. Clarrisa Costa, the organizing President of a proposed Rotary club in our area presently awaiting its charter — the Atlanta Brazil Rotary Club. Another member of this

new club, Josiane Carolino, came with Clarrisa to meet and hear our District Governor. The RC's of Marietta and Marietta-Metro sponsor the Atlanta Brazil RC.

Mary Ansley Southerland reminded everyone to attend the "Because of the Brave" celebration on Saturday, November 10th at the Marietta Country Club. This event thanks Cobb veterans for their service in military conflicts from WW II, Korea, Vietnam, the Gulf War and on to the present day. Today's "Sunshine" continued the theme of appreciating veterans in several ways. President-Elect Bethel recounted a brief history of Armistice Day known now as Veterans Day and then asked all veterans in the room to stand. Sixteen stood to rousing applause. Rotary veteran Jim Peeler, wearing a red poppy in his coat lapel, came to the podium to recite "In Flanders Fields," a poem from WW I written by Canadian physician Lt. Col. John McCrae after leading the funeral for a fallen comrade near the town of Ypres in Belgium. Past President and Superior Court Judge Reuben Green, a former Marine, introduced 20-year veteran Richard Honeycutt. Richard served in the Navy as an electronics technician and meteorologist. Richard's inspiring account of his life in the military, and how important for him was the feeling of military camaraderie, brought everyone to their feet in grateful tribute and appreciation.

Assistant DG Mark introduced today's speaker DG Court Dowis as his friend, a pilot, a race car driver and the president of Pine Mountain Club Chalets near Calloway Gardens. Following even more applause, Court called attention to this year's theme of Rotary International, "Be the Inspiration" espoused by RI President Barry Rassin, a member of the RC of East Nassau in the Bahamas. Court encouraged Rotarians

to grab and wear one of the "Be the Inspiration" pins placed on the dining tables. As he described his visits to every one of the 69 Rotary clubs in District 6900, DG Court stated amazement over one of our District's smallest and most enthusiastic clubs—the RC of Emory-Druid Hills. Although the club only has ten members, it's doing two global projects this year—one valued at \$200,000 and the other at \$290,000. During this declaration, Court wore a red chichia that the RC of Emory-Druid Hills gave him. DG Dowis is inviting every club in District 6900 to grow in membership by holding a social once a month, by inviting potential members to help in a club service project and by asking potential members to come to Rotary meetings. Court then described typical characteristics of people in the 20-35, 45-60 and older age ranges that could make them want to join Rotary. Court next turned his focus on the Rotary Foundation's annual fund, endowment fund and fight to eradicate polio. Last year, there were 57 cases of polio world-wide. This year there are only 22. Fifty percent of gifts to the Rotary Foundation return to a donor club in two years. A major forte of Rotary is its world-wide infrastructure. DG Dowis concluded his remarks by plugging the District 6900 Conference in Sandestin next April 25-28. PE Chris thanked Governor Dowis and promised a donation from the RC of Marietta in his honor.

Today's opportunity drawing conducted by new members **Neera Bahl** and **Jess Loper** brought no success to lucky ticket holders, **Jim Trapnell** and AG Mark. Our meeting closed with everyone reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Rotary's Four Way Test led by **Mark Adams**.

In Flanders fields.


Take up our quarrel with the foe:


