THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM DG Governor Alec Smythe Visit



DG Alec Smythe

District 6900 Governor Alec Smythe made his official visit to our Club this week. He attended a reception hosted by Daybreak Rotary and Griffin Rotary on Wednesday evening at the UGA Research and Education Garden, participated in our Board Meeting on Thursday morning, and addressed our membership during our weekly noon meeting on Thursday. DG Alec's remarks to the Club focused on the mission of Rotary and how we as Griffin Rotarians can make our community and our world a fundamentally better place in which to live. Smythe noted that Rotary unifies members from all walks of life. Relationships within Rotary have shifted from topdown leadership models to more effective networks that are focused on attracting people of action and not just the senior member of the firm. He added, "Rotary is a huge force multiplier."

Rotarians as a group can achieve far more than an individual. "It's been 41 days since a case of polio has been reported," he said. It now appears that polio will be only the second disease to be eradicated in the history of man. And, Rotary is the driving force in this effort with matching dollars from the Gates Foundation and a number of national governments. But, Smythe added, Rotary is focused on many more projects than just polio. Donations to the Foundation also allow clubs to fund projects in their own local communities. He also recognized that the "social capital" realized in Rotary really strengthens bonds within communities and helps amplify our impacts. "Rotary welcomes divergent views, opinions, and ideas," he said. "That interaction of diverse thought is good for our community and for our health." Smythe also noted that each year there are more Georgians but there are fewer Rotarians in Georgia. He encouraged all Rotarians to invite people to join Rotary making sure that those non-Rotarians see us as a more diversified group that makes huge impacts. In closing his remarks, he asked that we give at least 5% of our funds to PolioPlus saying that we have a chance to make a permanent mark on our world by eradicating the disease. He also asked that we invite our friends to get involved in Rotary. "Rotary has changed my life," he said. And, the Rotary experience can change others while helping to make our world a better place in which to live. He encouraged the Club to do something new. "We may need more than one kind of Rotary or more than one way to achieve our mission." And, finally, he urged us to think about the mission rather than Rotary rules.
