THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM **Technical College System of Georgia**

Gretchen Corbin, Commissioner of the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG), visited Griffin Rotary on Thursday to update those attending on TSCG and its impacts in education and economic development. TSCG serves every citizen in Georgia with its 22 colleges and 85 campuses that are strategically located so that every Georgian is within a 30-minute commute to a campus. Current total enrollment is 133,081 students and 52,338 adults. There are 600 programs to meet personal needs of students. Twelve of those are tuition-free programs. Corbin noted that 99% of graduates from TCSG schools are placed in jobs or successfully transfer to other institutions of higher learning. A major mission of TSCG is economic development through workforce development. And, she feels that these efforts contribute to the recognition of the state of Georgia as #1 in the U.S. for building business for the past 5 years. Georgia Quick Start program has been a division of TSCG for 50 years. Quick Start offers free services

to any qualified company that is expanding its workforce or adding new technology. Quick Start is recognized as the nation's #1 workforce training program. Since 1967, more than 1.25 million Georgians have been trained by Quick Start in 6,900 projects. Corbin is also excited about TSCG's recent involvement in the Dual Enrollment program whereby high school students can earn college credit for free while completing their high school diploma. Over 21,000 students are currently taking advantage of this program. It has grown 3-fold in TSCG institutions over the last 4 years. The HOPE Career Grant is also offering opportunities to qualified students for free tuition in 12 programs of study. That number of programs will be expanding to 17 in the next year. College and Career Academies (CCA) now number 40 across the state, with one located here in Griffin. About 26,000 students are enrolled in CCA's. And, another 7,500 take advantage of apprenticeships in 127 programs. Corbin also notes that TSCG works very closely with the University System of Georgia (TSG) in serving the educational needs of our populace. Here locally, we are well aware of the impact of Southern Crescent Technical College (SCTC) which also has a campus in Thomaston and supports 3 centers. More than 200 programs are offered at SCTC with 6,527 students and 1,742 adults enrolled. SCTC offers 20 general education courses that transfer to all USG institutions. And, it has a 98.4% job placement rate for its graduates.
