President Jesse called Lance Burchett to come forward to be inducted into the club. He is being sponsored by **Debra Day**. Lance Is employed by Kennesaw State University in the development function. He has served as president of several other clubs and was warmly welcomed.

President Jesse asked for any Sunshine reports. **Jim Fausett** indicated that he had a suggestion that potentially could turn into one of the biggest fundraisers ever for the club. He suggested a policy that Mark Barbour be required to contribute 5 bucks to the Sunshine fund every time he interrupts or "blurts out" spontaneously. Not to be outdone, Mark immediately blurted. He offered \$20 to the fund for the next 4 blurts.

President Jesse called on **Reuben Green** to introduce our program. Judge Green indicated that Hank Klibanoff joined Emory University after a 36 year career in journalism. He has worked with papers in Mississippi, the Boston Globe, Philadelphia Inquirer and AJC. He is an author who has won a Pulitzer Prize and many other awards involving journalism. He is a graduate of Washington University and Northwestern. He resides in Atlanta and is married with 3 children.

Hank directs the Georgia Civil Rights Cold Cases Project at Emory University which engages Emory undergraduate journalism students in examining unsolved racially motivated murders during the civil rights era. He indicated the project began with journalist interest in southern cases where justice has not been fulfilled. He said the south has many legacies some that are wonderful and some horrific. Hank indicated that Justice can be achieved by discovering what really happened and publicizing it.

Hank presented several cases of minority victims who had been beaten and killed and their attackers, who went free for years before being brought to justice. Examples include Sam Bowers who was free for 30 years after murder and Bobby Frank Cherry who bombed a church in Alabama killing 4 little girls. He even bragged about it openly.

Another example was Isaiah Nixon who was murdered in 1948 for voting. He was a father of 6 in Montgomery County, a hard-working laborer in the turpentine industry. Two white men beat him up and shot him for voting. His wife is still alive at 95. His family fled Georgia and years later when they returned could never find his gravesite. The Emory students working this case researched it and located the grave site 67 years later for the family to see. The nephew of the now dead man who

killed Isaiah read about the case and met with the family to apologize. In a way some justice prevailed.

After questions President Jesse thanked Professor Klibanoff and indicated a book would be devoted to the Marietta Schools in honor of his presentation.

Jim Kellogg and **Marla Blackstone** handled the opportunity drawing. Remember 5 black balls and 1 red ball. First drawing **Daniel White**, now 4 black balls and 1 red. Second drawing **Charles Kilgore**, alas now 3 black balls 1 red. More to come next week.

There being no further business President Jesse closed the meeting.
