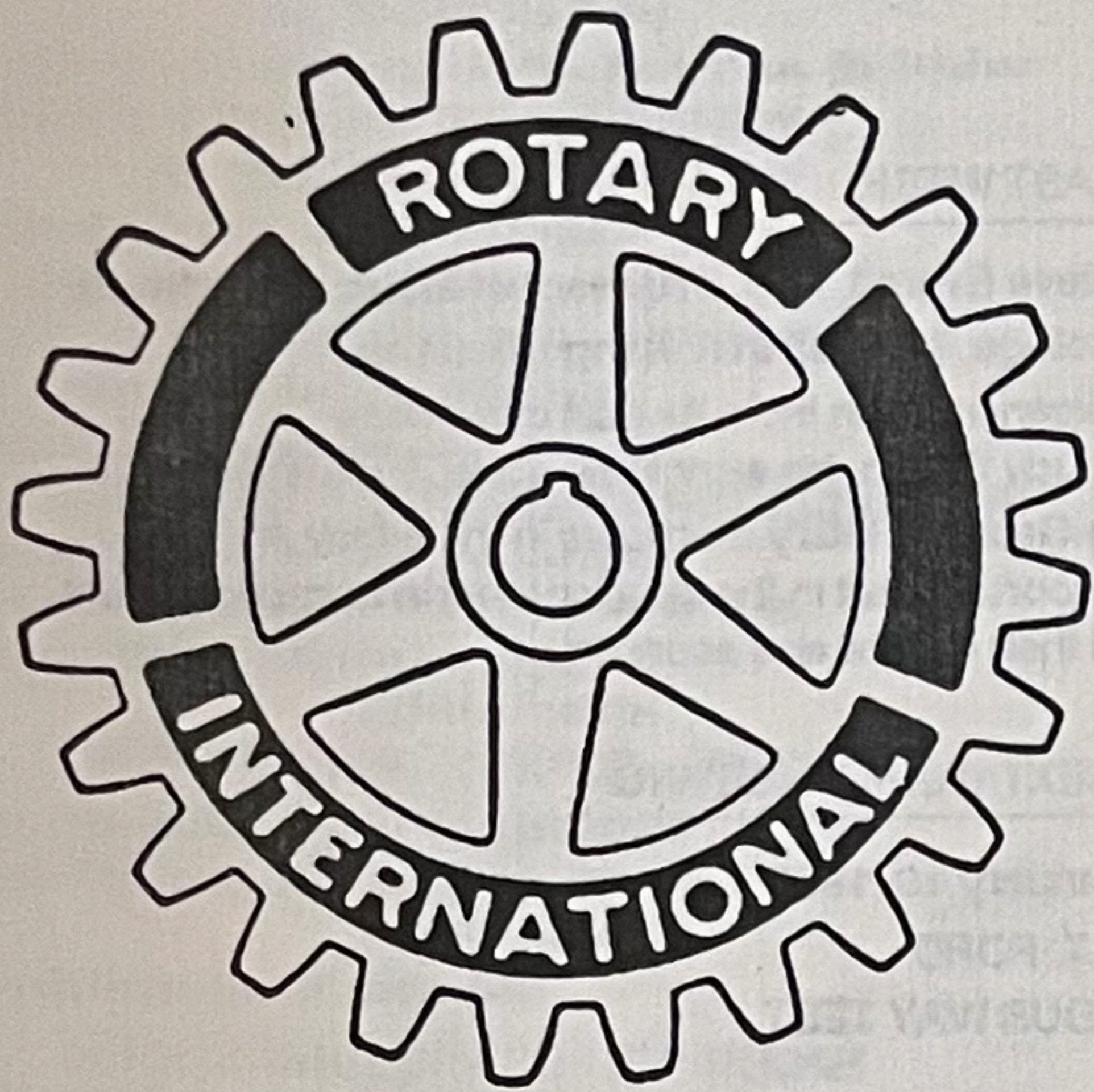

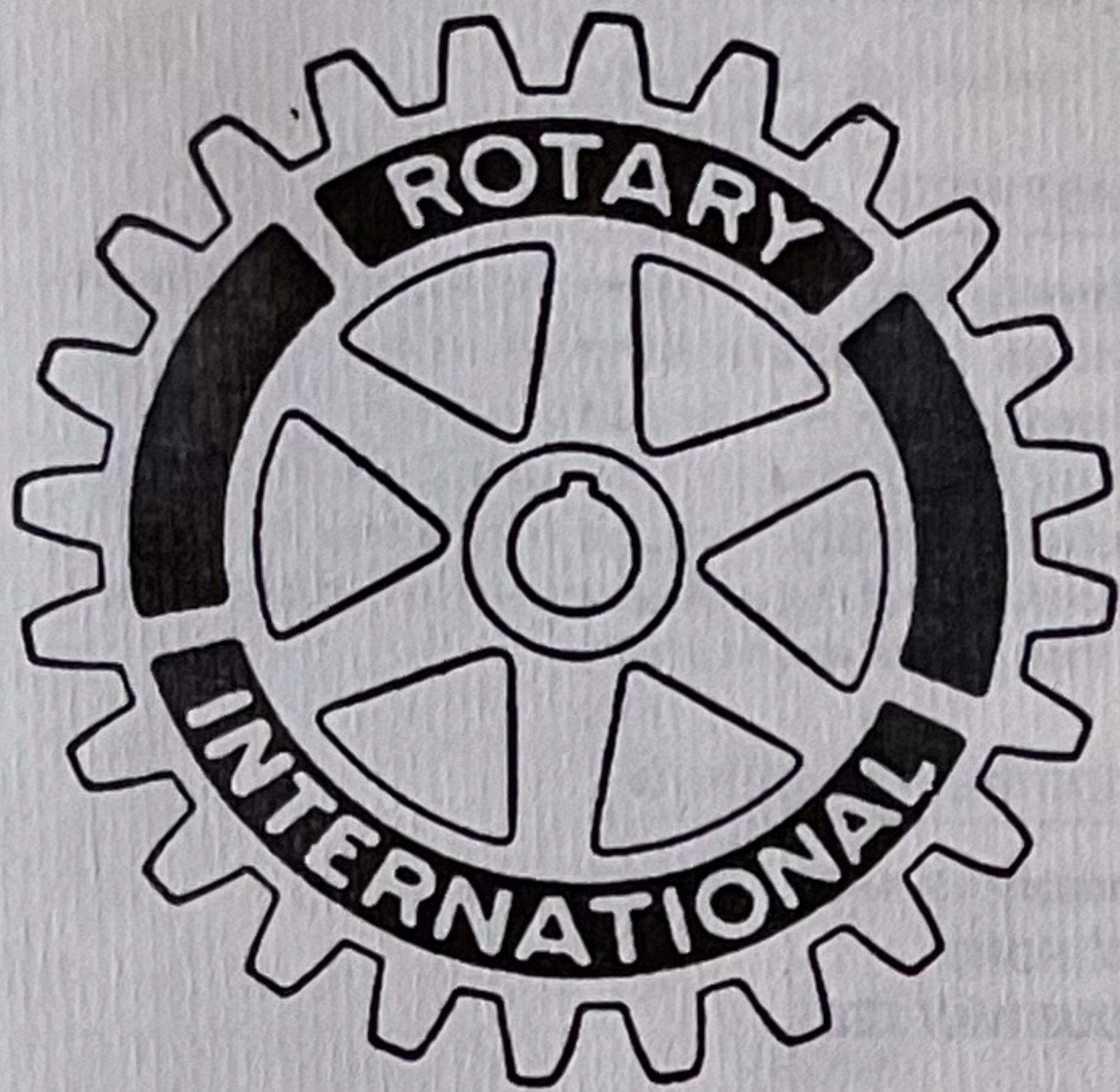

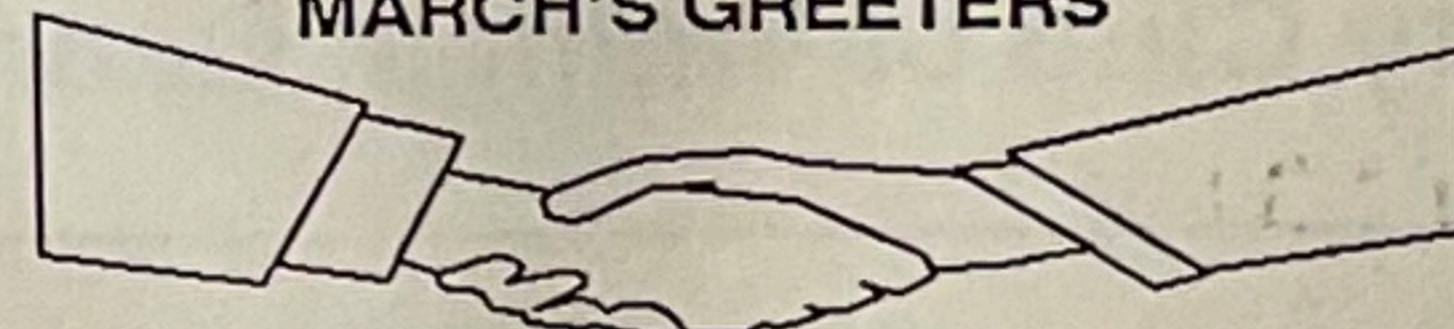
LAST WEEKS SPEAKER

ROTARY INDUCTION

We welcome you to the fellowship of Rotary. You are joining over one million Rotarians, with twenty-two thousand Clubs, in over hundred sixty different countries. We are a group of professionals and executives from all walks of life the world over, trying to serve society.

You don't want to join Rotary to serve your own business needs. Our motto is "Service above Self."

You don't want to join Rotary just to have lunch once a week with the same group of people. We attempt to do more than simply "meet and eat."

You don't want to join if you can't meet our attendance requirement. We ask that you meet weekly with our group or one of the other twenty-two thousand Clubs around the world, because we believe that attendance keeps us active and interested in all our programs. You will enjoy making up meetings at other clubs.

You don't want to join Rotary just to put "Rotary" on your resume.

You should, however, join Rotary if you: (a) enjoy a fellowship with professional people at luncheons, parties, and outings, (b) want to put a little something back in your community, (c) enjoy working on international projects and you believe in promoting international understanding, and (d) are occasionally willing to put service before your job, your leisure, and your family.

We have found that some members are more active than others.

Our classifications are limited, and we ask that in the event you find that Rotary is not right for you, that you allow your classification be given to someone who may find Rotary more beneficial. However, by asking you to join Rotary, we think that you will make a fine addition to our Club.

There is no formal oath required for joining Rotary, but I will ask that you answer the following three (3) questions which state the ideals of Rotary. If true, I will ask you to answer "I will" to each:

1. Will You maintain high ethical standards in your business while serving in Rotary?
2. Will you adopt Rotary's ideal of "Service above Self" in your personal business and community life?
3. Will you strive for the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through Rotary International?
