THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Miracle League = Miracles for All Involved



Perhaps the best way to summarize Thursday's program was to hear and see our own Emily Wallace (see picture to the left) at the conclusion of the program as she exclaimed her love of the Miracle League program in Convers and tearfully thanked her coaches who have impacted her own life. Stephanie Davis of the Miracle League (pictured with Emily) explained that the Miracle League was the brain-child of Convers Rotarian Dean Alford who realized the impact that youth baseball coach Eddie Bagwell had made in inviting the first child with a disability to play on his team. Realizing that the standard baseball diamond presents a number of obstacles for those who may be in wheelchairs or using walkers, the league which had thrown out its first pitch in the spring 1999 season

designed, developed, and built a complex with cushioned rubberized surfaces, wheelchair accessible dugouts, and completely flat surfaces. The word about this Miracle League spread quickly, largely through Rotary International and attention by prominent sportscasters including those on ESPN. Davis led the effort to build the second Miracle League complex in Myrtle Beach, SC. She eventually moved to Covington, GA, where she works with the Alford family in helping additional communities construct their own Miracle League fields and complexes. "My primary job is to assist communities in the process so that they do not have to re-invent the wheel. I can help with the policies, procedures and other details of planning and construction," she added. There are now over 300 communities in 4 countries with Miracle League facilities. "And, we are adding 20 complexes a year," she said. The success of the League, however, is not just facilities but participation by the community. Davis showed a short video, Kids Helping Kids, to underscore that everyone involved learns valuable life lessons. Each player has a "buddy" who assists the player in various ways. Players and their buddies often become good friends so that their relationship extends beyond the diamond and game day. While buddies are important, the relationships among the players are also important. Davis explained that no one every 'ages-out' of the Miracle League. "Our oldest player is 89 years old," she said. There are currently about a dozen fields in the Atlanta area. Davis said that a goal of the League is to have fields within commuting distance for all wishing to participate. She invited those interested to visit their website at miracleleague.com and to contact her if anyone knew of a community wishing to build a Miracle League complex.
