



# District 6900 2019-2020 District Grants

## **District Grant**

For 2019-20 clubs eligible may request up to **\$2000** in funding for a service project. This amount reflects our donations to the annual fund in 2016-17. District 6900 Clubs may use grant funds alone or partner with other District 6900 Rotary Clubs to fund larger, more costly projects. Only one regular district grant per club and only one project per grant request. No required contribution amount from club funds to the project. Clubs in top 5 of total Annual Fund giving for 2016-17 are eligible for an additional \$1000.

## **Connecting through Service Projects**

There will be at least one \$10,000 grant awarded through a competitive process. The project must be within District 6900. Evaluation criteria will include: Foundation area of focus, documented need, impact, results, sustainability, public image, collaboration, and Rotarian engagement. More details on the competitive grants will be available at District Assembly.



## **Important Dates**

To be eligible, spending report for 2018-19 grant completed and **accepted** by March 31, 2019  
Applications for 2019-20 due no later than May 15, 2019  
Spending Reports due 30 days after funds spent and no later than March 31, 2020

## **Grant Requests and Reports will be submitted online at Rotary6900.org**

We would also like one picture showing Rotarians as People of Action working on the project submitted with the spending documentation.
